West Van artist digs deep

Work addresses concept of 'hero' in thoughtprovoking show

WEST Vancouver multimedia artist Neville Grey almost didn't respond to a call to be part of a group show exploring the idea of heroism.

"I really struggled with this theme as to what it really meant, and what is a hero and what isn't and how to approach

it in different ways," he says.

However Grey drew upon his inner resources, convincing himself how frustrated he'd be if he didn't rise to the occasion, and on the last day of the competition took the plunge. That move proved to be fruitful as he was ultimately one of 20 artists chosen for Heroes, opening this week at Vancouver's Pendulum Gallery.

The exhibition is just one of the many events organized as part of the 2010 Kickstart Festival, offering up art shows, performances and workshops from March 8 to 27, timed with this month's Vancouver 2010 Paralympic Winter Games. Kickstart Disability Arts and Culture is a Burnaby-based organization focused on producing and pre-

senting works by artists with disabilities.

Often, individuals with disabilities, especially those with visible disabilities, are regarded as heroes, says Bernadine Fox, co-curator of Heroes.

"So the whole notion of



Interested in exploring this idea, Kickstart organized the exhibition to deconstruct the notion of heroes and put it back together from a disability perspective.

"It's a really powerful show of professional artists who are coming together who just happen to also have disabilities," says Fox.

She adds she hopes the featured works encourage the viewing audience to use their own critical faculties to explore the idea of

One of Grey's collage works featured in the show came into

being as a result of a recent visit to Barcelona, Spain, a sort of pilgrimage he undertook in search of his art heroes — Picasso, Miró and Gaudi.

"I was looking for the essence of these creators," he says. "I've wanted to go there for my whole life and finally had the chance to do that recently. They'd all spent a bunch of time in the city walking around the streets creating work and I just wanted to go and experience that environment myself. I wanted to see if the sound, the feel or I don't know, the smell of the artist still existed."

His second featured collage work is entitled Beware of Your Heroes, a more sinister piece.

"We need to constantly reassess who our heroes are and what they are giving back to us," he says.


Many of our society's heroes are simply individuals who've gained notoriety as celebrities, for example sports personalities, politicians, business people and artists.

"Even the smallest of achievements can get you that moniker. For me it's particularly troublesome," says Grey.

"I just want us to be careful in who we exemplify and for what

For example, palliative care volunteers are individuals who act out of the goodness of their hearts, not for any self-serving rea-

"Those, I think, are the real heroes in our society, they do it because it's the right thing and proper thing to do and not because they're expecting any recognition from it," he says.




